The readings of the selfregistering thermometers give the maximum and minimum temperature for the twenty.four hours succeeding the noon of the day for which they are entered. The record of rain is that given by the Beckley gauge on the ground, which is examined each day at noon. The amounts of horizontal motion of the wind, given on pages 3 to 14, are those deduced from the small anemometer mentioned on page x.
